

Buying and selling an MG - notifying DVLA of a change of registered keeper

Notifying DVLA of a sale

Following the sale and purchase of the car, the **seller** as the Registered Keeper must complete **Section 6** (the New Keeper Details) of the V5C vehicle registration certificate with the buyer's details as the New Keeper <u>and</u> complete **Section 10** (the New Keeper Supplement) and then remove Section 10 and give it to the buyer.









Then **both the seller and buyer** must sign and date the declaration at **Section 8**. The first page of the VRC (Sections 1 to 7) must be sent immediately to the DVLA. This is particularly important for the seller because if the seller does not notify the DVLA that they have sold the car, they will continue to be responsible for licensing the car and ensuring it has a current MOT certificate and motor insurance cover. You will find most sellers will insist, not unreasonably, that they attend to this and ensure the first page of the VRC is mailed to the DVLA immediately. It is wise to have with you a C5 envelope and a stamp for that purpose.
